Free counselling for you and your family

Family Relationship Support for Carers (FRSC) is a Victorian Government funded service that provides free counselling and mediation for parents and carers of children with disability.

Services are offered to individuals, couples, siblings or the whole family and are available to families across Victoria.

FRSC can help with future planning, mediating family conflict, and counselling to work through issues connected with your caring role.

Sessions can be face-to-face, by telephone, or online.

Behaviour support in your child's NDIS Plan

If your child has behaviour that is challenging to manage, you may be able to get support through your child's NDIS Plan.

To get behaviour support in your child's NDIS Plan, you will need to provide evidence of your child's behaviour and have a goal of improved relationships, such as 'I would like support to increase my ability to understand my emotions and behaviour'.

Behaviour support is usually NDIA managed. This means that you can only use NDIA registered practitioners to develop these plans and strategies.

The Hidden Disabilities Sunflower is recognised by Metro Trains, airports across Australia, shopping centres, libraries and more.

You can pick up free Hidden Disability Sunflower products from major train stations, the City of Melbourne tourism hubs and Travellers Aid at Flinders Street and Southern Cross stations. You can also order low-cost lanyards and wristbands online.
